
**SUBJECT:** Re-alignment of the Office of the Deputy Assistant Secretary for Administration and Budget/CFO (DAS-OAB/C) and the Office of the Deputy Assistant Secretary for Public and Assisted Housing Delivery (DAS-PAHD).


**SCOPE:** The scope of this Supplement encompasses the impact and implementation of the realignment of the Offices of the DAS for AB/C and PAHD, Office of Public and Indian Housing (PIH).

1. Organizational Chart – A copy of the to and from organizational chart will be provided to the union and affected employees.
2. Bargaining Unit – No positions will be removed from the bargaining unit as a result of this re-alignment
3. Position Description – This re-alignment will not affect employees' position descriptions or duties.
4. Space Moves – Employees will not move as a result of the re-alignment. Should Management propose to move employees, the Union will be notified in accordance with Article 5 of the HUD/AFGE Agreement.
5. Contracting Out – No function(s) will be contracted out as a result of this realignment.
6. Vacancies – Any newly created positions will be filled in accordance with Article 13 of the HUD/AFGE Agreement.
7. Upward Mobility – Management established one (1) upward mobility position as part of the re-alignment.
8. Progress Reviews – Management agrees to ensure that all employees affected by this re-alignment will receive a progress review, as applicable, from their current supervisor.


9. HUD Interns – All affected Interns will be permitted to rotate throughout PIH and be given substantive duties.
